Each of the “Network” Members listed below are well-established U.S.-based, non-profit associations that provide industry-recognized, nationally portable certifications for the professional, frontline workforce and organizations involved in global supply chain and logistics—including factories, warehouses, distribution centers and transporters.



The Association for Operations Management offers two certification programs, **Certified in Production and Inventory Management (CPIM)**, and **Certified Supply Chain Professional (CSCP)**. The American Society of Transportation & Logistics offers the following professional level certifications: **Certified in Transportation and Logistics (CTL)**, **Professional Designation in Supply Chain Management (PLS)** and the **Distinguished Logistics Professional (DLP)**. The Institute for Supply Management™ offers the **Certified Professional in Supply Management® (CPSM®)** and the **Certified Professional in Supplier Diversity™ (CPSD™)**. The CPSM® surpasses the demands of the international marketplace with multi-faceted skills in areas such as *finance, supplier relationship management, organizational global strategy and risk compliance*. The CPSD™ is for supply management professionals whose responsibilities include supplier diversity.



The Manufacturing Skill Standards Council offers the first ever industry recognized, nationally portable certification for front-line material handling and distribution workers throughout the supply chain: the foundational level **Certified Logistics Associate (CLA)** and the mid-level technical **Certified Logistics Technician (CLT)**.
